Whereas, the Herricks U.F.S.D. has an approved Annual Professional Performance Review ("APPR") Plan in place, effective for the 2019-2020 school year;

Whereas, the District has submitted an Undue Burden Independent Evaluator Hardship Waiver application to the State Education Department since compliance with the independent evaluator requirement would create an undue burden on the District;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the Board of Education hereby approves and ratifies the District's 2019-2020 submission of the Undue Burden Independent Evaluator Hardship Waiver application to the State Education Department;

Be It Further Resolved, that the Board hereby ratifies the execution of the Hardship Waiver application by the Superintendent of Schools and the Board President.

Approval to Declare Emergency and Provide Funding for Replacement of the Generator for Network Operations Center (NOC) at the High School The following resolution has been prepared for the Board's consideration:

Resolved: that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education hereby approves the following resolution:

Whereas, on or about August 8, 2019, the generator at the Network Operations Center at Herricks High School failed; and

Whereas, said system is required to preserve the health, safety and welfare of the students and staff in the building and to preserve the building; and

Whereas, an investigation of the damage reveals that the Herricks School District requires the following remediation: replacement of the generator at the Network Operations Center;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the Board of Education declares the replacement of the generator at the Network Operations Center at Herricks High School to be an emergency; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Board of Education authorizes said remediation work as an ordinary contingent expense and authorizes the Superintendent of Schools, or his designee, to take the necessary legal steps to perform said remediation;

Be It Further Resolved, that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education hereby awards a purchase order in the amount, not to exceed, \$30,000 to Diesel Systems Repairs, Inc., 175 Liberty Street, Copiague, NY 11726 for the replacement of the NOC generator at the High School.

F Approval of Professional Development Workshops

The following resolution has been prepared for the Board's consideration: **Resolved:** that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education hereby approves Dr. Nanci Smith of Effective Classrooms Educational Consulting, LLC, 8501 W. Clara Lane, Peoria, AZ 85382, to facilitate four professional development workshops on October 15, 2019, January 17, 2020, March 10, 2020 and March 11, 2020. The cost for each workshop is \$2,500.00 for a total cost not to exceed \$10,000.00.

Note: Dr. Nanci Smith will facilitate two cohorts of teacher trainers/administrators workshops during the four dates noted for 2019/2020. The first session will be on October 15, 2019. Cohort 1 will focus on strategies to serve as turnkey trainers of differentiated instruction. Cohort 2 will focus on theory and practical implementation of differentiated instruction through hands-on activities, discussion prompts, development (or partial development) of lessons and tasks. The fee will be paid via grant funds. Dr. Smith is an expert and national trainer on the topic of differentiated instruction.

G Approval of Professional Development Workshops

The following resolution has been prepared for the Board's consideration: **Resolved:** that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education hereby approves Center for Responsive Schools to facilitate a four-day professional development workshop for dates to be determined during the 2019-2020 school year. The total cost for the workshop is \$21,000.00 for up to 30 participants. Roslyn Public Schools and Herricks Public Schools will be co-hosting the training entitled, Responsive Classroom Elementary Core Course. Herricks Public Schools will be sharing the training fee with Roslyn apportioned at a cost of \$700.00 per person. Herricks will have 9 participants for a total reimbursement to Roslyn Public Schools of \$6,300.00. The fee will be paid through grant funding.

Note: Responsive Classroom is a student-centered, social and emotional learning approach to teaching and discipline. It is comprised of a set of research- and evidence-based practices designed to create safe, joyful, and engaging classroom and school communities for both students and teachers. The four-day course focuses on the skills and practices of building positive community, effective management, and engaging academics. Participants explore key *Responsive Classroom* teaching practices: Morning Meeting, Academic Choice, rule creation,

Interactive Modeling, positive teacher language, and responding to misbehavior (including logical consequences).

H Approval of Agreements for Special Education Related Educational Services The following resolution has been prepared for the Board's consideration: Resolved: that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education hereby approves agreements for Special Education Related Educational Services for selected students and Special Education Consulting Services to the District during the 2019-20 School Year with the following service providers and authorizes

- 2. North Coast Psychological Services, PLLC

Note:As per Board Policy #6700, the School District may engage the services of professionals without the need for seeking alternative proposals. The individual or company should be chosen based on accountability, reliability, responsibility, skill, and education. The Board of Education authorized an Inter-Municipal Cooperative Agreement for Special Education Related Services Request for Proposal (RFP) on March 9, 2017 to participate with other Nassau County public school districts for the solicitation of proposals for Special Education Related Services on a cooperative basis, subject to the terms and conditions of the IMA. Service providers denoted with an (*) responded to the RFP. All contracts have been prepared by our attorney.
